

The Degree of Master of Linguistics (MLing – 180 points)

These regulations must be read in conjunction with the General Regulations for the University.

1. Version

- (a) These Regulations came into force on 1 January 2018.
- (b) This degree was first offered in 2016.

2. Variations

In exceptional circumstances the Amo Matua, Toi Tangata | Executive Dean of Arts or delegate may approve personal programme of study which does not conform to these Regulations.

3. The structure of the qualification

To qualify for the Master of Linguistics a student must be credited with a total of 180 points including:

- (a) LING691
- (b) either
 - i. 90 points from LING courses at 400 or 600-level (excluding LING400 and 480); or
 - ii. 60 points from LING courses at 400 or 600-level (excluding LING400 and 480) plus 30 points from Schedule E to the degree.

4. Admission to the qualification

To be admitted to the Master of Linguistics a student must have:

- iii. been qualified for a bachelor's degree with a major in Psychology, Sociology, Anthropology, Philosophy, Computer Science, languages, or a different major approved by the Tumuaki Tari, Te Tari Mātai Wātereo | Head of the Department of Linguistics, with at least a B+ Grade Point Average or better in 60 points of 300-level courses in the majoring subject, and achieved at least a B+ in LING 400 English Structures; or
 - iv. been admitted under the Regulations for admission with Academic Equivalent Standing as entitled to enrol for the Degree of Master of Linguistics; and
- (b) been approved as a student for the degree by the Amo Matua, Toi Tangata | Executive Dean of Arts or delegate.

5. Subjects

The subject for this degree is Linguistics.

6. Time limits

- (a) The time limit for a full-time student is:
 - i. a minimum of 12 months
 - ii. a maximum of 18 months.
- (b) The time limit for a part-time student is:
 - i. a minimum of 24 months
 - ii. a maximum of 36 months.
