

The Degree of Master of Urban Resilience and Renewal (MURR – 180 points)

These regulations must be read in conjunction with the General Regulations for the University.

1. Version

- (a) These Regulations came into force on 1 January 2025.
- (b) This degree was first offered in 2016.

2. Variations

In exceptional circumstances the Amo Matua, Pātaiao | Executive Dean of Science or delegate may approve a personal programme of study which does not conform to these Regulations.

3. The structure of the qualification

To qualify for the Master of Urban Resilience and Renewal student must be credited with:

- (a) 150 points from Schedule C to these Regulations; and
