

Regulations for the Professional Master of Computer Science

These regulations must be read in conjunction with the General Regulations for the University.

1. Introduction

- (a) These Regulations came into force on 1 January 2025.
- (b) This degree was first offered in 2021.

2. Personal Programme of Study

In exceptional circumstances the Amo Matua, Pātaiao | Executive Dean of Science or delegate may approve a personal programme of study which does not conform to these regulations.

3. Qualification Requirements

To qualify for the Professional Master of Computer Science a student must be credited with a minimum of 180 points towards the qualification; including:

- (a) 120 points from Schedule E; and

- (a) COSC401-499 (except COSC460, COSC461, COSC470, COSC475, COSC476, COSC480, COSC486),
 - (b) SENG401-499 (except SENG402),
 - (c) DATA425, DATA430-439,
 - (d) With the approval of the Tumuaki Tari | Head of Department, up to 30 points from another subject.
- A student wishing to apply for a transfer to the Master of Science in Computer Science Part II must take COSC469.
